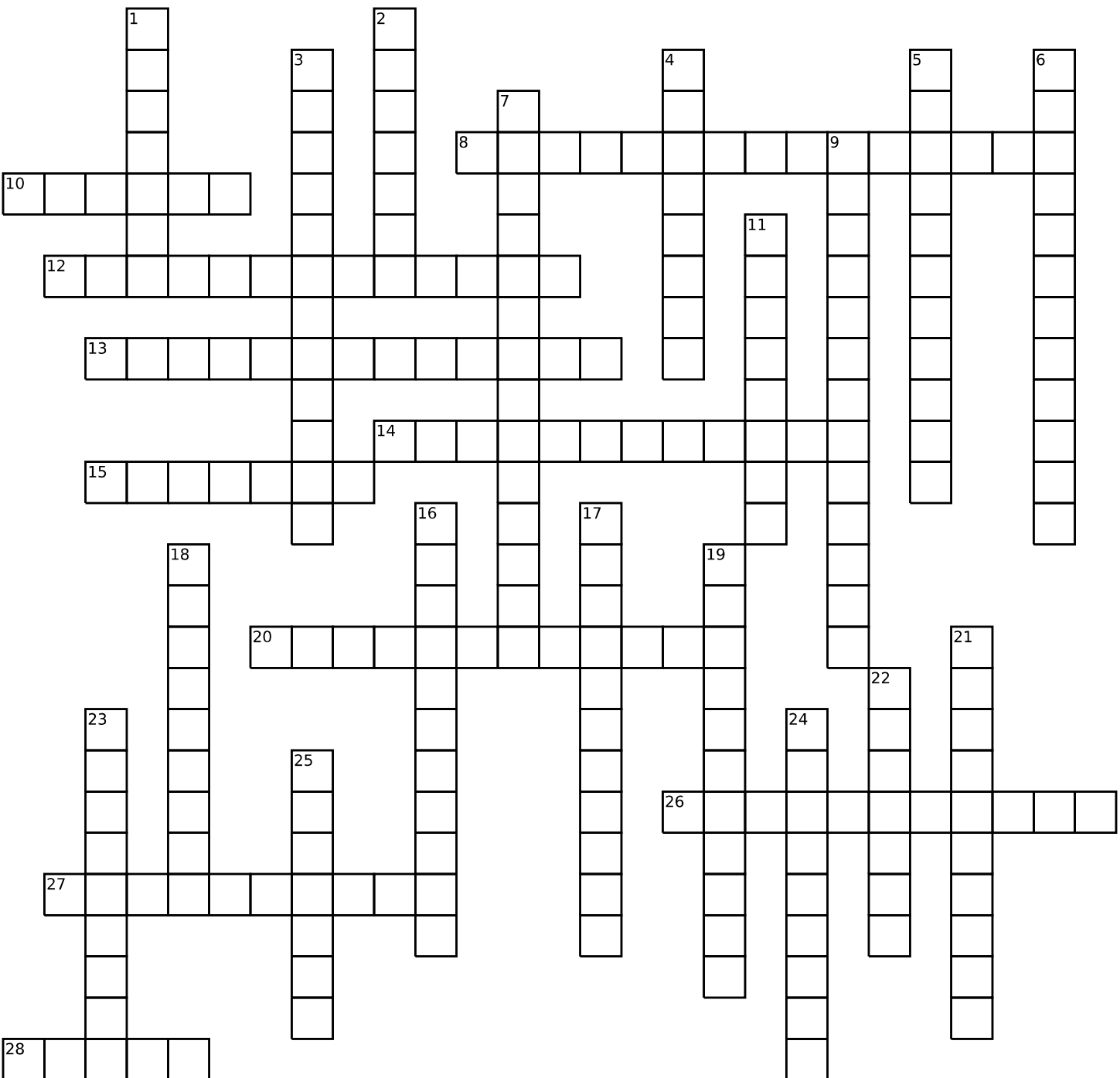

- 1 Someone who moves on a religious or holy journey.
- 2 A theory utilized in multiple religions where a person reaches a higher plane of existence or their ultimate goal in life. To be at peace.
- 3 An advance state of human society, where complex cultures, law structures, and religions usually become prevalent.
- 4 An item left behind by people. Usually studied via archaeological digs.
- 5 "Cave man", they were present approximately 100,000bc-30,000bc, and used basic stone tools.
- 6 The belief in a single god
- 7 The early phase of the Stone Age, where early humans utilized mostly stone tools and were hunter and gatherer societies.
- 9 An early form of writing utilized in Egypt, looks like picture writing.
- 11 A trade route named after one of its main exports, Silk. It stretched over 4,000 miles between The East (China) and the West (Europe).
- 16 A system that breaks people down into certain social castes depending on their birth and jobs. Used in ancient India.
- 17 Rule by the few, usually a rich upper ruling class.
- 18 A type of government ran by a religious leader, a modern day example is Vatican City.
- 19 The student of ancient artifacts left behind by prehistoric peoples.
- 21 The period of history before the written language.
- 22 A sequence of rulers from the same family or group.
- 23 An early type of writing that looks like a series of symbols and wedges, dated to around 3,000bc.
- 24 Roughly 3,000bc to 1200bc, humans utilized Bronze weapons and tools, this paved the way towards the Iron Age.
